Keynote Speaker:

Laurie Garrett: "Behind the Scenes of the Ebola Crisis"

Since 2004, Laurie Garrett has been a senior fellow for global health at the Council on Foreign Relations (CFR) in New York. Ms. Garrett is the only writer ever to have been awarded all three of the Big "Ps" of journalism: the Peabody, the Polk, and the Pulitzer. Her expertise includes global health systems, chronic and infectious diseases, and bioterrorism. She has written for many publications, including *Foreign Affairs*, *Esquire*, *Vanity Fair*, *the Los Angeles Times*, *the Washington Post*, and *Current Issues in Public Health*. She has appeared frequently on national television programs, including ABC's *Nightline*, *NewsHour with Jim Lehrer*, *The Charlie Rose Show*, *The Oprah Winfrey Show*, *Dateline*, *The International Hour* (CNN), and *Talkback* (CNN).
